

**BAPTISMS:** Parents should make arrangements with the Pastor at least one month before the date wanted. Baptism is celebrated on the FIRST and THIRD Sundays of the month at 12:30 PM. Preparation is held on the SECOND *TUESDAY* of each month, 7:30 PM, in Room 18 of the Church Building. Godparents must be practicing the faith and present a Letter of Eligibility from their parish. No date can be set for baptism until parents have fulfilled these responsibilities.

MATRIMONY: To set a date for a wedding, couples must make an appointment at the Rectory at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Weddings can be scheduled for most Saturdays, at 12:00 Noon or 2:00 PM, or on Friday afternoons.

**REGISTRATION**: All Catholics who live within the parish boundaries should register. Boundaries: South of Street Road from Lower State Rd., to Norristown Rd., to County Line, to Blair Mill Rd., to Moreland Rd., to Maple Ave., to Horsham Rd., to Limekiln Pike, to Lower State Rd. & back to Street Road.

My Dear Parishioners,

It was a very different and difficult experience celebrating Mass last Sunday, without a congregation. I know how painful it must have

been for you to be away from the Mass and receiving the Eucharist. If nothing else, this coronavirus is giving us all a "wake-up" call to not take for granted what a gift God has given us in giving us the Mass. I wonder if this is what those who grew up with religious oppression or experienced life where they were not able to participate in Mass went through? I firmly believe that we cannot give up hope, we need to believe that God is with us even, at times, when it does not feel like it.

I am happy to tell you that St. Joseph was able to broadcast our Sunday Mass on three different venues. We were able to make an audio recording of the Saturday vigil Mass and it



was broadcast over WRDV-FM 89.3, on Sunday at 9:00 a.m. as we have been doing for many years. The Saturday vigil was also being video recorded/live streamed on the Church's



Facebook page. I didn't even know we could do this. Finally the video was put up on our parish website, <a href="www.saintjosephchurch.us">www.saintjosephchurch.us</a>. There is also a video archive to view previous Masses. I will continue to celebrate

Mass privately and include you in my prayers. My plan is to continue with recording and broadcasting the Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation as well. Things are changing so quickly, so I do not know what form these future recordings may take, but I will do my best to see that they continue.

I am sure that many people are suffering now, and if St. Joseph can do anything to help you, please let me know, but I need to appeal to all parishioners that you continue supporting the Church. The weekly



Sunday collection is our main source of income. As you can imagine, our weekly income has dropped precipitously. I beg you to please drop off your envelope at the rectory, or put it in

### Saint Polycarp (died 155)

### February 23

"Eighty-six years I have served Christ, and he never did me any wrong. How can I blaspheme my King and Savior?" Boldly answering the official who demanded he worship pagan gods, Polycarp, today's "Senior Citizen Saint," demonstrates that courage, far from being the preserve of the young, is a virtue cultivated through lifelong fidelity and crowned by final perseverance. A disciple of Saint John, who is said to have consecrated him bishop of Smyrna in modern-day Turkey, Polycarp witnesses to the truth that, whatever time and space may separate us, Jesus' gift of the Eucharist unites us. Polycarp's final words, preserved by the Church of Smyrna, sound like a Eucharistic Prayer in which the saint offers himself: "Lord, almighty God, Father of your beloved and blessed Son Jesus Christ, through whom we have come to the knowledge of vourself . . . may I be received among the martyrs as a rich and pleasing sacrifice . . . through the eternal priest of heaven, Jesus Christ . . . through him be glory to you, together with him and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. ### Give Glory to God

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, just before we begin to enter Holy Week, we are summoned to Bethany. If we had been friends of Mary, Lazarus, and Martha, and found out that Lazarus was gravely ill, we probably would have dropped everything to be with them. This was what was so surprising about the behavior of Jesus. Although he was their close friend, he chose to stay away, that God's glory would be manifested. This is a persistent theme in John's Gospel. Right to the very end, Jesus' works were meant to give glory to the Father. As our Lenten journey reaches a crescendo, let us be mindful that, as people who have "put on Christ" in baptism, we are also called, by our attitudes and actions, to give glory to God.
