

BAPTISMS: Parents should make arrangements with the Pastor at least one month before the date wanted. Baptism is celebrated on the FIRST and THIRD Sundays of the month at 12:30 PM. Preparation is held on the SECOND *TUESDAY* of each month, 7:30 PM, in Room 18 of the Church Building. Godparents must be practicing the faith and present a Letter of Eligibility from their parish. No date can be set for baptism until parents have fulfilled these responsibilities.

MATRIMONY: To set a date for a wedding, couples must make an appointment at the Rectory at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Weddings can be scheduled for most Saturdays, at 12:00 Noon or 2:00 PM, or on Friday afternoons.

SICK CALLS: Phone the Rectory, 215-672-3020.

REGISTRATION: All Catholics who live within the parish boundaries should register. Boundaries: South of Street Road from Lower State Rd., to Norristown Rd., to County Line, to Blair Mill Rd., to Moreland Rd., to Maple Ave., to Horsham Rd., to Limekiln Pike, to Lower State Rd. & back to Street Road.

If you are not registered, we cannot serve you in ways which require us to know you. Please call the Rectory (215-672-3020.) We will welcome you as part of our community of faith.

My Dear Parishioners,

It has been a real joy seeing this young lady grow in her musical talents and we have benefitted greatly from them. Please join me in congratulating her.

I want to thank all those who continue to support our parish throughout this pandemic. Whether you are able to join us for Mass in person, online, or via the radio, it is important to recognize that we are still a community. It is easy to forget that given the present circumstances. Thank you to those who still are dropping off your envelopes in the rectory door mail slot, in the collection box in the back hallway – by the crucifix, or online. While we did receive the PPP Loan, to assist us during the crisis, the money only goes so far.

When I made adjustments to the Mass schedule, I did it hoping that we would soon be able to get back to our regular routine. At present, there is no indication when that will be. The retired priests from Regina Coeli are still not permitted to assist, and while I have enjoyed having my friend, Fr. Confessions: Saturdays 3:30 – 4:30 p.m.

Sunday Mass:

Saturday Vigil at 5:00 p.m. Sunday 7:30 a.m. 9:30 a.m. 11:30 a.m.

In the past, I have received several requests to move up our Vigil Mass time and I thought this might be the ideal time to do just that. Also some people have mentioned that they really miss the former 8:30 Mass. While there is no way to please everyone, I thought that this schedule seemed reasonable.

Congratulations!

We are honored to announce that the Association of Church Musicians of Phila. (ACMP) have selected our cantor, **Graciela Cohen** to receive both the Peter LaManna Scholarship and the Service Award for 2020.

The Peter LaManna \$1000 Scholarship is awarded each year to a student who is involved in their Parish Liturgy singing as a cantor, choir member, or playing an instrument. In order to receive this Scholarship, the recipient must have acceptable grades in school. They must be approved by their Music Director, Pastor, and Principal, and must continue studies in Liturgical Music. Application for this Scholarship also involves a formal interview and audition.

Each year ACMP also presents a \$200 Student Award to five outstanding High School seniors and a \$100 Student Award to five 8th graders for service to their parish Music Ministry. The goal is to foster a love of liturgy and music as well as encourage active and enthusiastic participation among our youth. This Service Award recognizes outstanding participation in parish Music Ministry program in any capacity; the outstanding student is highly engaged, dedicated, teaches and leads others, and embodies a spirit of leadership and prayer that inspires others.

We are proud that our cantor here at St. Joseph Church, Graciela Cohen, was selected to receive both of these distinguished awards. There were many other applicants, but Graciela's commitment, hard work, beautiful talent and faith shone through! We would like to thank Graciela for volunteering so much of her time to our Parish. All her hard work practicing is evident in the beauty she adds to our liturgies as she leads the assembly in song. Congratulations, Graciela! Well deserved!!

Saint John Mary Vianney (1786-1859)



SAINT JEAN BAPTISTE VIANNEY,

August 4

A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially *this* one!"

The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed forty-two years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth."
