

A Note From The Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,
Last week the parish bulletin was never delivered to us, so I apologize that there were none to handout after the Masses. Our bulletin publisher did produce them, and one was available online; however, there was a problem with the delivery. They are looking into the situation. In the meantime, I am republishing my column because it is about next week's Mission speaker's home diocese.

Next week we will welcome Fr. Chacko to speak to us about the Missions in the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, India. Fr. Chacko will preach all the Masses and the second collection will be to support the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, through the Pontifical Mission Society.

The Bishop of the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, submitted the following to help understand what is happening in his Diocese.

God Bless you, Fr. Bordonaro

The Diocese of Pathanamthitta is just 11 years old and it tries to give the Gospel of Our Lord to the 45,000 faithful of the Diocese and 1,500,000 inhabitants of the county of Pathanamthitta. Altogether we have 107 priests in the diocese and some of them are retired from active ministry due to their old age and some of our young priests are studying in India and abroad. Right now we have 65 priests in active ministry in mission churches and different institutions. And we do have a total number of 56 seminarians studying in various seminaries, from 1st year to the 12th year of formation to priesthood. Their parents are financially not well off to support them to provide their basic needs in the seminary. So, it is the responsibility of the Diocese to provide all their basic needs during their formation of 12 years. The Diocese do not have a dependable source of income to provide the salary of the priests, missionaries, catechists and the basic needs of the seminarians, such as food, medical insurance, study materials, tuition fee, etc...


Our primary concentration is in reviving and consolidating the spiritual renewal of the faithful through separate prayer groups formed for men, women and youth. We have 100 mission stations/ churches in the new Diocese. They are all very spiritual, attentive to Catholic faith and sound moral conduct. We have given special emphasis in forming BCC (Basic Christian Communities), mother's forum, corner prayers, forming youth group (Malankara Catholic Youth Movement), teaching catechism to the children up to 12th grade in all the mission churches. We do have almost 4,200 children studying in catechism classes from 1st year to 12th. We have made arrangements in each church to provide regular classes to the children on Sunday's after the Holy Mass.

We give great priority in assisting the poorest of the poor through Self-Help-Groups (SHG) of women to eradicate poverty and strengthen cultural and social setup. SHG's provide support in organic farming, poultry farming, goat rearing and growing more trees for environmental protection by providing trees-umbrella-cover for the Earth. This year because of this particular situation of the Covid-19, we have prepared 350 food packets and distributed them to the poor people every month from June 2020 to till now. *(Continued on page 3)*

Reflect on the Readings DECISIONS

There is an axiom that states, “Not to decide is to decide.” This saying was popular in the turbulent times of the Vietnam War. It urged us not to allow others to answer the moral questions raised by our nation’s involvement in that terrible conflict, but to decide for ourselves. Making such choices is never easy. Avoiding them is common. Jesus, for his part, was not only a gallant risk-taker, but a clear decision-maker. As he pursued the mission to which the Father called him, he continually decided for us and for the Father. He worked hard to lay out a scenario that would enable others to make similar choices. Never did he make decisions for others or force others into decisions, even decisions that had eternal ramifications. Jesus is inviting us to make such decisions today. We won’t be absolutely sure. What is sure, however, is the command that issues from God’s word: Take the risk. Decide!



Feast Of Faith Come, Spirit!


The presider at the Eucharist can choose from among a number of different Eucharistic Prayers, all of which follow a similar pattern. Almost always, they begin with an epiclesis, a Greek word that means “invocation upon” or “calling over here.” At this moment in the prayer, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine that we have brought to the altar: “Father, we bring you these gifts. We ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit, that they may become the body and blood of your Son” (Eucharistic Prayer III). The words of the prayer are accompanied by the ritual gesture of the laying on of hands, the ancient sign of the gift of the Spirit, which is also used in most sacramental celebrations, from the rite of confirmation to the ordination of deacons, priests, and bishops. Liturgists sometimes call this first epiclesis the epiclesis of consecration. Later in the Eucharistic Prayer, there will be another epiclesis, the epiclesis of communion, as the priest asks that the Holy Spirit be sent upon us to transform us. “Grant that we, who are nourished by his body and blood, may be filled with his Holy Spirit, and become one body, one spirit in Christ” (Eucharistic Prayer III).

Treasures from Our Tradition

The Eucharist was never meant to be only “comfort food,” something that makes us feel warm and satisfied. It is to be bread for the journey, nourishment for the task that God has set for our community and for each one of us. Thus it is not surprising to see some walk away in today’s Gospel, for they understood that recognizing Jesus as the bread of life is a commitment to changing one’s life.

St. Augustine, whose feast we celebrate this week, once



observed that in celebrating the Eucharist we become what we receive, the Body of Christ. As we conclude the series of reflections in John’s Gospel on Jesus as the bread of life, it is appropriate to think about the role that the Eucharist plays in our lives and in our parish. It is in the

Eucharist that we are nourished and renew our commitment in faith to serve the Lord. How does the parish social ministry carry out that mandate? How do you carry it out in your own life? Is it related in any way to the celebration of the Eucharist? How does celebrating Mass Sunday after Sunday make a difference in your life and in the world?
