## NOTHING EARTHLY LASTS FOREVER

“Teach us to number our days aright.” Is there a more wise and prudent prayer for people of all ages than this verse from today’s responsorial psalm? As we savor the lovely but limited days of summer we are reminded that nothing lasts forever. In today’s first reading, the master teacher (Qoheleth) asserts “All things are vanity!” while the Gospel of Luke describes the ease with which our possessions can possess us. The second reading makes the point as well: “Think of what is above, not of what is on earth.” We see the problem of wealth from both sides today—from the viewpoint of the wealthy person who inevitably has to leave his riches to someone else and from the perspective of the potential inheritor who is at odds with his brother over how to divide their inheritance. The problem is clear; the wisdom is also.

### YOU CAN’T TAKE IT WITH YOU

Stephen Covey, in his book *The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People*, lists as his second habit: Begin with the end in mind. Is that not the point of our scripture reflections today? We know we will die. We know we “can’t take it with us.” If you’ve ever been tasked with cleaning out the home of a deceased person, you know how easily once-treasured items simply become another burden to deal with. Or you may have experienced how quickly the joy of owning the latest smart phone becomes as outdated as the model itself. So how do we think about all the stuff that we buy, accumulate, fret over where to store, and pay taxes on? Heaven forbid if we ever have to move!

### RICH IN WHAT MATTERS TO GOD


Luke sets us on the right path when he affirms that we must be “rich in what matters to God.” Needless to say, he is not saying that possessions themselves are evil. Today’s psalm asks God—twice—to “prosper the work of our hands for us!” The danger is that, as one wag put it, “we never have enough of what we don’t really need.” What does matter to God? What is the opposite of vanity? Kindness to one another, mercy, forgiveness, generosity to the poor and needy—all of these remain beyond death. These are what we can take with us when we die. The great mystery in all this is that God is never outdone in generosity; the more we give away, the more we have.

July 31 is also the feast day of Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). He epitomizes richness in what really matters. His military and court aspirations evaporated after he was seriously wounded in battle. His subsequent change of heart led him to found one of the most influential religious orders in the history of the Church. If the opposite of vanity is wealth that remains after death, Ignatius is most appropriately honored today.

I found some information about him from his diocesan website and thought you might be interested in learning more about him.

My name is Fr. Ildefonce Mapara, OSB, a Benedictine monk from Tanzania. I live in Klamath Falls at St. Pius X Catholic church. I am in residence and do travel in different places in the country to seek funds for social projects in southern Tanzania. I am pleased to share with you my vocation story though the website of the Diocese of Baker.

I was born on 15th of July 1960 in southern Tanzania. I joined monastic life in 1987 and was ordained a priest on June 29th, 2000. Since when I was about 10 years old I thought about being a priest. Nobody ever directly or indirectly asked me about becoming a priest. I had seen the missionary priests from Germany and thought it would be a good thing to be saying Mass for the people. But that was a child's way of thinking. I did not know what was to come with that kind of a calling. As I went to school I was able to learn more about our Catholic faith. I had a very good catechist who taught catechism and Bible stories, a summary of the major events in the Bible. It was really an eye opening experience regarding the Catholic faith and its traditions. My dad was very devoted Catholic and never missed Sunday Mass unless he was sick. This too had an impact in my life. It really imprinted in my mind the importance of doing what is supposed to be done by a believer.

As my history was continuing to be unveiled I ended up going to a High School run by Benedictines. Seeing their lives I was attracted to them. But also during this time I could think a little more maturely and tried to decide who I wanted to be - a monk priest or get married. The gospel of Matthew in which Jesus condemns those that did not attend the needy persons kind of pushed me to choose life that will make me always aware of my obligation as a believer. So I came to a conclusion that monastic life or priesthood will put me in an environment that I will always be aware of my faith and live it. Today I think this was and is a sound reason to be a monk and a priest. I have the opportunity of saying Mass every day. I have to say my prayers every day. The schedule at the abbey is designed in a way that the whole day is centered around praying: in the morning (vigils and lauds), midday (midday prayer), late afternoon (vespers) and before going to bed (compline) plus many other spiritual exercises like meditation and retreats. 

## Treasures from Our Tradition

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agajanian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed! —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.




