
BAPTISMS: Parents should make arrangements with the Pastor at least one month before the date wanted. Baptism is celebrated on the FIRST and THIRD Sundays of the month at 12:30 PM. Preparation is held on the SECOND TUESDAY of each month, 7:30 PM, in Room 18 of the Church Building. Godparents must be practicing the faith and present a Letter of Eligibility from their parish. No date can be set for baptism until parents have fulfilled these responsibilities.

MATRIMONY: To set a date for a wedding, couples must make an appointment at the Rectory at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Weddings can be scheduled for most Saturdays, at 12:00 Noon or 2:00 PM, or on Friday afternoons.

Dear Parishioners,

I recently returned from my retreat. I spent some time with the Benedictine Monks in Cleveland. It was good being with them and praying with them. I prayed for all in our parish community while on retreat. I also had the privilege of baptizing my grandniece and spending some time with family.

As our nation prepares to celebrate Halloween, it is a good opportunity to remind our young people that the Christian roots of this secular holiday involve our belief that the saints in heaven are praying for us. All Saints Day, Wednesday Nov. 1st, is also known as All Hallows Day. The day before All Saints Day is known as All Hallows' Eve, which is where we get the word Halloween from. The day after All Saints, Nov. 2nd, is All Souls Day. It is the day that we set aside to pray for all those souls that have experienced bodily death and are not yet united with God in heaven. We pray for the healing and purification of their souls so that they will be united with God. These holy days are good reminders that our Church (the Communion of Saints) is much bigger than just the here and now.

Our Mass schedule for All Saints Day, which is a Holy Day of Obligation, is as follows. The Vigil Mass will be on Tuesday, Oct. 31st at 5:30 p.m. Masses on the Holy Day, Wednesday, Nov. 1st will be at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. and also 7:00 p.m. On Thursday we will have 2 Masses: our regular 8:00 a.m. Mass and a special Memorial Mass at



7:00 p.m. for all those who lost loved ones over the preceding year. We will read out the names of the people of St.

Joseph Parish lost over the past year. All are welcome to attend this Mass to pray for their deceased loved ones, even if it has been longer than a year.

As we close out the month of October, we will be submitting our "October Count" results to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. You may have noticed our Ushers moving through the aisles with clickers. They were taking a count of the number of people attending each of the Weekend Masses in October. These numbers are collected from across the country and throughout the world and then submitted to Rome. I have not seen the final tabulations yet, but I am afraid that the numbers may indicate a decrease in attendance. Perhaps we can use this as an opportunity to recommit ourselves to regular attendance at Saturday night or Sunday Mass.



Treasures From Our Tradition

There is a show on public television in which people search their attics for heirlooms, dust them off, and trek them downtown for ruthless evaluation by teams of antique experts. Occasionally the owners are surprised to learn they have been harboring priceless artifacts: a Tiffany bowl used to catch the car keys, a Van Gogh in the downstairs bathroom. What they lugged downtown in a paper bag, they carry home in bubble wrap and receiving blankets.

It's the same way with treasures in Church life. Lots of things were lugged up into the attic years ago, and it was inevitable that some treasures ended up in the trash. Many Catholics tucked the sacrament of penance away in a dusty corner. We know it's there if we need it, but it is not the weekly routine it once was, like the Saturday bath "whether I need it or not." Today, especially in Lent and Advent or as part of personal preparation for marriage, ordination, or other life transitions, the sacrament of penance is a treasure of the Christian life waiting to be discovered.
