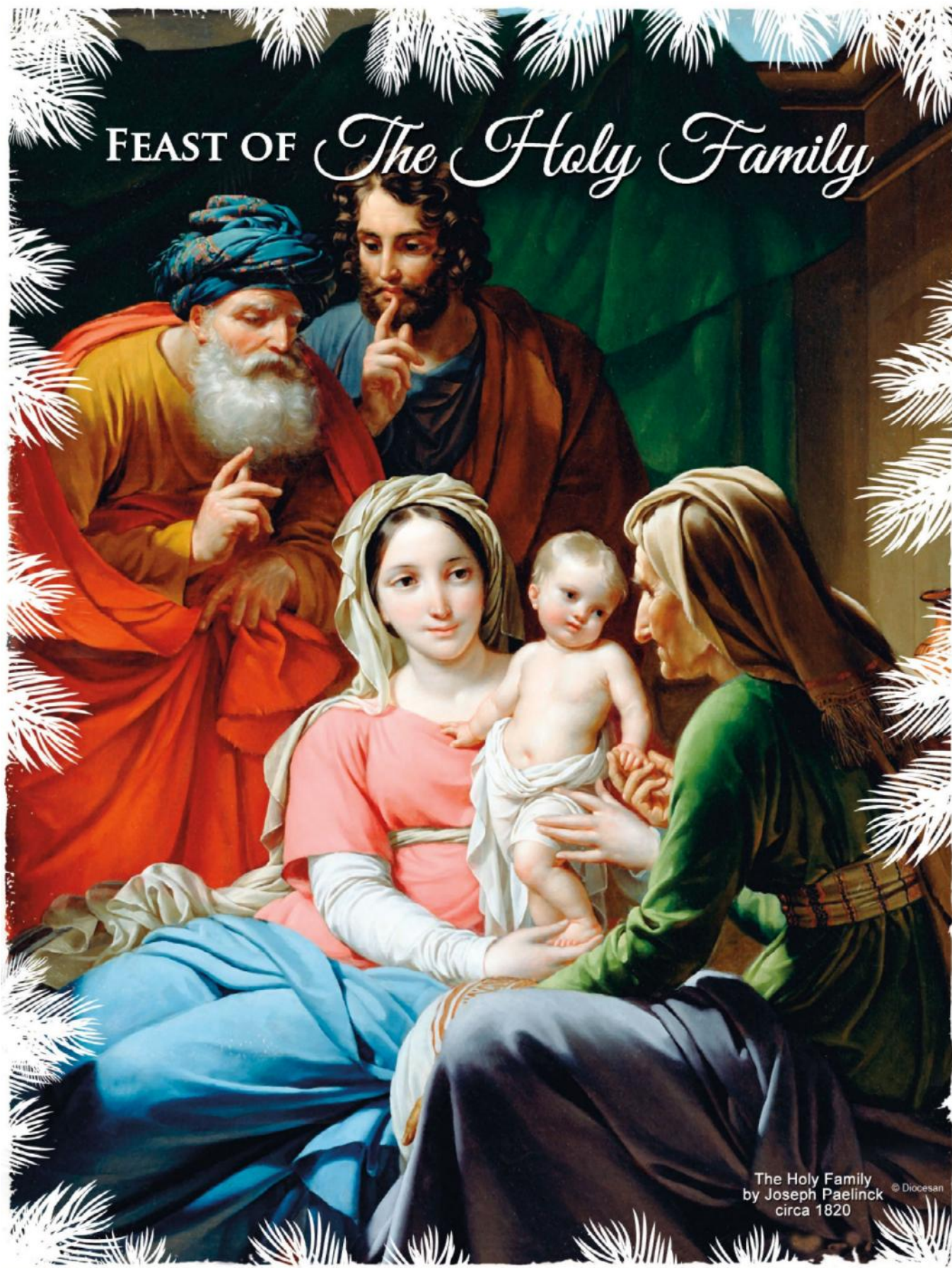

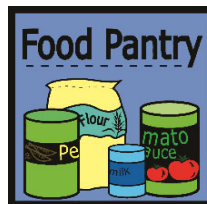

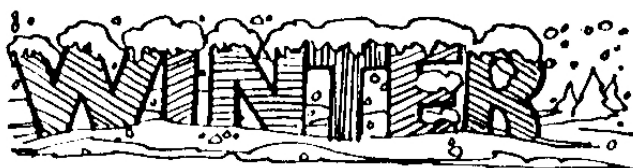

As we begin the New Year at SJR it is good to take a look back at some of the highlights of the previous one. Some of them were related to our Catholic identity. The blessing of the mornings and the afternoons, the First Friday Masses, attending Stations of the Cross, the 8th grade retreat and graduation, and the celebration of First Penance, First Communion, and Confirmation, to name a few.

Some highlights were related to school projects, processes and programs. Steps taken were based on the action plan we developed as part of our Middle States reaccreditation in the spring of 2022. We purchased a new science program so that our instruction is more closely aligned to current science standards. To support our reading and math, we continued to use iReady, an online diagnostic and instructional program, for a second year resulting in timely data for instructional decision making. We also implemented a new online registration and enrollment process to facilitate a smooth process for new and returning families. In addition, we moved to a new student information system which impacted everything from taking attendance to issuing report cards.

Some of the highlights were related to strengthening our school community. Our Home and School Association hosted a number of wonderful events. New families were welcomed. Fundraisers paid for upgraded safety glass in our exterior doors, health and safety initiatives, chrome books, and iReady. Other events that have become valued traditions – like our water ice dance party, cookies and milk, and tree lighting at Christmas - were opportunities to gather and enjoy each other's company.

So, as we prepare for the New Year, I am recalling this past one with gratitude to our faculty, staff, students, school families, and parishioners. Thank you for your ongoing support and prayers! Happy New Year!
