



A Note From The Pastor



My Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend at the Vigil Mass the Most Reverend Christopher Cooke, Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia, will officially install me as your

new pastor. I am so happy!!!!!

The Rite of Installation of a Pastor is a relatively new Rite in the history of the Church. In the "Good Old Days," a new Pastor just showed up with his letter of appointment and took over.

I think a public Liturgical Rite is a much better approach. This gives both a Pastor and his parishioners an opportunity to celebrate the appointment under the watchful eye of a generous and loving God and the Patron of the Parish.

The Rite of Installation begins at the main doors of the church and renews our understanding of our church. Bishop Cooke will read:

In the name of Archbishop Perez, Fr. Pawelko, I entrust to you this parish church. Dedicated under the title of St. Joseph, this church is above all a house of prayer, a temple of worship, a home in which the faithful are nourished by the Word of God and the Sacraments of the Church.

It is a dwelling place of God on earth, a temple built of living stones, founded on the Apostles, with Jesus Christ as its corner stone.

It is here, that, through the waters of baptism, God's people die to sin and live again though grace as adopted children of God.

Here, they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and gather around the Altar to celebrate the memorial of the Paschal Lamb, being fed and nourished by Christ's Body and Blood.

Here, they celebrate the Sacraments of healing and reconciliation so that they might experience the peace which only Christ can give them.

It is here that men and women are united in marriage to be a sign of the love Christ has for His Church.

It is here that those who have died are brought by their loved ones to be commended to the loving mercy of God.

Fr. Pawelko, may you always serve the faithful of St. Joseph Parish with zeal, fidelity, and sincere devotion, so that all people may come to know Jesus Christ our only true High Priest and Shepherd.

After this instruction at the main doors of our beautiful church Mass will continue as usual until after the homily.

After the homily, our local Dean, Monsignor Marine will read the Decree appointing me Pastor.

The Decree reads:

Announcement for everyone's safety

Recently, there have been some issues with homeless people at our parish, including people sleeping in our church and on the steps of our church.

On behalf of our pastoral council, I wish to announce some changes for everyone's safety.

For everyone's safety, we are now locking all doors except the parking lot door after morning Mass from Monday through Saturday.

Anyone wishing to visit our beautiful church during the day will be required to *use the parking lot door*.

If there is a funeral, doors will remain open until after the funeral.

On Saturday afternoons, all doors will be unlocked before the Vigil Mass.

Please remember, our parish and our parishioners are very generous and support many outreaches for those in need.

I encourage those who wish to do more for the homeless to seek opportunities to personally volunteer at a shelter.

I discourage anyone from giving money directly to a homeless person but to instead support those nonprofits that aid the homeless. A good place to start is Catholic Charities. Also, I encourage all parishioners to be vigilant and, if something looks out of the ordinary in our church or on our parish campus, to please contact the Warrington Police Department. By contacting the proper authorities, we can keep each other safe and get those who may be homeless into the programs they need.

This Fall, the pastoral council and I will be exploring further safety improvements including security cameras and improved exterior lighting.

I thank everyone for their understanding and support in these changes. Together we can all keep our parish a safe home for all of us.




