A Note From The Pastor

My Dear Parishioners,

I come from a long line of union members. In our family we have had Steelworkers, Drywall Finishers, Electricians in the IBEW, and Teamsters. I myself was a member of the Machinists.

So, for my family, Labor Day was always much more than an acknowledgement that summer was winding down. In our house, Labor Day was an acknowledgement of the contributions of the labor movement to our nation. Labor Day was also an opportunity to give thanks to God for those who sacrificed so much so that we can now have a living wage and decent working conditions.

This weekend we celebrate the fact that God gave us the power to work. In the beginning *God blessed them (Adam and Eve), and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth (Genesis 1: 28)."*

By doing so, God actually gave us a share in this work of creation: *The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it (Genesis 2:15).*

Just think, in God's plan to create the world, He included our creativity. Amazing.

In return for God giving us this great grace, we should do all work for His Glory and the good of souls. It does not matter how big or small that task is. When the task is done with the attitude that it is a contribution to the work of creation, it becomes a blessing for ourselves and for others.

When we work, we improve ourselves as we grow in skill and knowledge. When we do our work for the Glory of God and the good of souls, we grow in Grace as well as in skill and knowledge. This attitude then keeps all things in context and keeps us fixed on the world to come. Pope Leo XIII teaches: *But the Church, with Jesus Christ as her Master and Guide, aims higher still. She lays down precepts yet more perfect, and tries to bind class to class in friendliness and good feeling. The things of earth cannot be understood or valued aright without taking into consideration the life to come, the life that will know no death....God has not created us for the perishable and transitory things of earth, but for things heavenly and everlasting; He has given us this world as a place of exile, and not as our abiding place. As for riches and the other things which men call good and desirable, whether we have them in abundance, or are lacking in them-so far as eternal happiness is concerned - it makes no difference; the only important thing is to use them aright. Jesus Christ, when He redeemed us with plentiful redemption, took not away the pains and sorrows which in such large proportion are woven together in the web of our mortal life. He transformed them into motives of virtue and occasions of*

merit; and no man can hope for eternal reward unless he follow in the blood-stained footprints of his Savior. "If we suffer with Him, we shall also reign with Him." (Rerum Novarum: On the Rights and Duties of Capital and Labor). (Continued on page 4...)

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your prayers and support that allowed me to attend a summer service trip in June. During my service trip to Homestead, Florida, my classmates, teachers, and I ran a STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) camp for the children of low income families. Because the parents of the children worked in agriculture, we taught the children about soil and farming during our week. On Monday, we used augers to see the different layers of soil in the ground by the school. On Tuesday, the students, in two groups, used sand, different types of rocks, dirt, and clay to replicate the layers of soil we had seen in the auger. They also learned about animals and plants on a farm, creating lists of each to put in the classroom. On Wednesday, we visited a local farm and got to see all the animals, pet some of the fowl, and shear the sheep. At the farm's butterfly garden, we learned about the stages of a caterpillar becoming a butterfly and fun facts about butterflies. (Butterflies cannot fly in the cold, and cars are the butterfly's greatest predator.) On Thursday, the children created dioramas of what they learned throughout the week. On Friday, we played the children's favorite games. In the afternoons during the trip, we would run around in the sun with the children, and we learned that the children loved to play soccer and sharks & minnows.

When we weren't with the children or having meals as a group, we were helping with other tasks. One afternoon, we helped Brother Peter, the brother who ran the school where we had our summer camp, take down a fence around the playground so that the children could play on it. We helped him move supplies from the outdoor storage room inside so that it was more accessible for the teachers to use, and we helped run the Farm Share program. Local farms donated crops that would soon go bad to their impoverished families, and we helped distribute the fruits and vegetables so that people would get enough for their families.

During the week of my service trip, I grew closer with my friends, teachers, classmates I hadn't known well, and the people we served. Through our morning and evening prayer and reflection, I got to know the people around me a little better, and we all grew closer to the people we served through our service during the week. Many of the guys with me on the trip had little buddies by the end of the week. It was an incredible opportunity, and I am very grateful to have been able to do it.

Treasures From Our Tradition

Labor Day originated in 1882 in New York City under the aegis of the Knights of Labor. Congress made it a legal holiday in 1894. Observing it this week gives us a good opportunity to reflect on the Catholic Church's social teachings for the last century or so. On May 15, 1891, Pope Leo XIII issued the encyclical *Rerum Novarum* on the condition of the working classes and labor. In doing so, he initiated a century in which Catholic teaching became more and more involved in the social issues of the day.

Unfortunately relegated to the shadows while the bright lights of controversy shine on other issues, Catholic social teaching remains largely unknown to many Catholics. It is the Catholic Church that championed such notions as a fair day's pay for a fair day's work, and continues to uphold the dignity of the human person against attacks from governments and corporations. Nearly every pope since Leo XIII has issued teachings on the subject. Take some time this Labor Day to familiarize yourself with some aspect of the Church's social teachings. In doing so, you will be taking responsibility as a member of the Body of Christ to commit yourself to the care of your neighbor. —Rev. James Field
