

#### From the Desk of Fr. Pawelko

My Dear Parishioners,

It is a busy weekend at our parish with a Healing Mass and our Parish Picnic and a Hospitality Sunday. We wish to thank all who helped to make these events happen and also all who have helped to support these events and make them a great success.

We are happy to report that Warrington Township has approved our new digital sign. We will keep you updated as to when it might be finally installed. We will also be looking for someone with some computer savvy to help manage the sign. It will have a combination of regular messages and special event messages. This can be a nice way to serve our parish, and to do so from "behind the scenes." Please see me to help.

We are now in the month of the Holy Rosary. The Rosary is one of the most cherished prayers in the Catholic tradition. More than a repetitive recitation, it is a meditative journey that draws believers closer to God. Praying the Rosary offers numerous spiritual benefits that nourish the soul, deepen faith, and foster a profound sense of peace and purpose.

Here are just some of the spiritual benefits we gain by praying the Holy Rosary:

#### 1. Deepening Relationship with God

Praying the Rosary invites individuals into a closer relationship with God through reflection on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Each mystery encourages a deeper understanding of Christ's love and sacrifice, fostering spiritual intimacy and trust in God's plan. With each Hail Mary we repeat those beautiful words of the Angel Gabriel: *Hail Mary, full of Grace, the Lord is with you.* With each Hail Mary, we repeat those beautiful words of St. Elizabeth: *blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb.* 

#### 2. Fostering Inner Peace and Calm

The rhythmic repetition of prayers in the Rosary acts as a form of spiritual meditation. This calming practice helps quiet the mind, reduce anxiety, relieve stress, foster trust, and bring a sense of inner peace that can be felt throughout daily life.

#### 3. Strengthening Faith and Hope

Contemplating the mysteries of the Rosary reinforces core Christian beliefs and offers hope in times of doubt or challenge. By meditating on the joys, sorrows, and glories of Christ and the Virgin Mary, believers find encouragement and renewed faith to face life's difficulties.

#### 4. Gaining Spiritual Protection

Many Catholics believe that the Rosary serves as a spiritual shield, offering protection against temptation, evil, and spiritual harm. The intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary is sought for guidance, comfort, and safety.

#### **5. Cultivating Virtues**

Each mystery of the Rosary is associated with particular virtues, such as humility, patience, charity, and perseverance. Regular prayer helps cultivate self-discipline and virtue in daily life, leading to spiritual growth and moral strength.

#### 6. Encouraging Reflection and Gratitude

The Rosary encourages believers to pause and reflect on God's blessings and the lessons learned from the lives of Jesus and Mary. This practice nurtures a spirit of gratitude and a clearer sense of purpose.

#### 7. Uniting with the Universal Church

Praying the Rosary connects individuals with millions of believers worldwide. This shared devotion fosters a sense of community, solidarity, and support, reminding believers that they are part of a larger spiritual family.

Incorporating the Rosary into daily spiritual practice offers a wealth of benefits, from deepening one's relationship with God to fostering virtues and inner peace. It is a powerful tool for entrusting our loved ones, our cares, our concerns, ourselves to Jesus through Mary. It is a net that helps to catch souls. It is a chain that binds us to Heaven.

As we pray the Rosary, we can offer the entire Rosary for a special need. We can also offer each decade of the Rosary for a Special need. We can even offer each Hail Mary for our Special needs.

As a parish, we pray the Rosary after our 8:00AM Daily Mass, on Monday evenings at 7:30PM, and on Saturdays at 3:30PM.

In this month of the Holy Rosary, let us lay siege to Heaven with our Rosaries for our families, for our parish family, for our fallen away loved ones, for the sick, for the dying, for the dead, for first responders, for an increase of vacations for the priesthood, for peace in our world, for peace in our cities, for an increased love for Jesus—through Mary.

Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us! St. Joseph, Patron of the Church and our Patron, pray for us!


